



Corneal transplantation

Corneal opacities remain a leading cause of blindness in LMIC. While the PECI includes the intervention of corneal transplantation surgery, it is important to acknowledge that a considerable shortage of corneal graft tissue exists in many countries due to non-existent or inadequate eye tissue donation, banking and transplantation programs; one study estimates that globally, there is only 1 donated cornea available for every 70 needed (81). Out of pocket costs of transplant tissue, and related care, is also a major barrier for those in need of corneal transplantation.

Improved data on donation rates and population needs, coupled with clear policies and legislation and supportive governance oversight on both donation and transplantation, are required for Member States to establish sustainable corneal banking programmes. Given that some of the leading indications for corneal transplantation are avoidable (i.e. ocular trauma, corneal infection), a strong focus on prevention is also critical


